


Taking Tuart Place

A: He wanted to eat some chicken.


Q: Why do dragons sleep during the day?

# Telling our stories

Over the years, Mal has had the chance to speak with many published authors who are Tuart Place participants. This is his interview with Margo O'Byrne, who's book "Left Unsaid" was published in 2009.

#### Why is it so many of us need and want to tell our story?

For me it helped me "make sense of my childhood". Which leads to questions like these: "Why was my childhood not like everyone else's? Why was it all chaotic in my mind? Why did I feel that I had no structure to my childhood?" At a certain point you feel you have to find out. And like so many others you feel you have to record it. You have to write it down, and that's the start of the writing journey. I had no real idea of where I was going or even how to write a book at all. It was truly a journey of self-discovery and sometimes I didn't know where it would lead; I only knew that I had to get it out, as I said "to make sense of it". For me and many others the writing of the book was unsettling, even painful at times. In my case I went back to visit all the places of significance in my past. Can you imagine going back to revisit the *thirteen different schools I was sent to*?! And the memories that bought up?

#### Why do we write these books?

Well, I will tell you: *it is healing*. And *yes* it did help to make sense of my life And as others have said it has been healing not only for me but for all the others who have gone through similar situations and know that they weren't the only ones. It's a shared story for all of us Forgotten Australians. And for all of you who are thinking of writing I would earnestly say "**Do It!**"

Here are some of Leah's other tips...

AVOID CALLS WHERE THERE IS A DELAY BEFORE ANSWERING

DESTROY ALL DOCUMENTS WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFO.

CHECK YOUR BANK STATEMENTS BE CAUTIOUS
WHEN SOMEONE
IS TRYING TO GET
YOU TO MAKE A
QUICK DECISION

REACH OUT TO YOUR BANK TO QUERY UNKNOWN TRANSACTIONS.

I'm getting older, and have had a lot of trouble getting around for years. Even taking a shower was getting too hard for me. When I talked to the care finder at Tuart Place, she said she'd be able to get a package set up for me that would make it easier for me to stay at home. It has been such a good change in my life! They put special equipment in my bathroom so I can shower by myself again, and someone comes to help me clean the house. I can get someone to drive me to places I need to go too. It has changed my life. I feel safer when I am at home and out and about – I know I can do things, I am enjoying myself, and it's easier to stay in touch with the people I love.
