Dale has been a role model, a positive influence and an inspiration for many Care Leavers and is an example of what one person can strive for and achieve in the face of decades of adversity.



Introducing Pauline! An interview by John

What is your working background?

I've been working in the community sector for about 10 years now. I started off with Lifeline WA and then moved into family and domestic violence education. Before I did my degree in Psychology I did a lot of different jobs working in hospitals and schools and good ol' hospitality (back in the olden days!). I love working with people, and so I always did some sort of work that involved interacting with others.

What attracted you to Tuart Place?

I heard about Tuart Place when I was a student at Notre Dame. I knew then I wanted to come to work here (that was about 7 years ago!) I went away to live back in NSW for a short period a couple of years back, and when I got back last year, I really wanted to find something new for 2025. When I saw the job for Redress Counsellor at Tuart Place, I just had to apply. Once I met Pip and Jo and they invited me to stay for lunch after my interview, I just knew this was going to be the right place for me. Lucky for me I got the job!

Luckily for me I've always loved most jobs I've had. I think the only job I never really liked I left at the end of week one! But there is something extremely special about Tuart Place. I think it's the combination of everyone being accepting and caring for one another. That goes for the participants and staff. There's a genuineness about the folks at Tuart Place that it is pretty much impossible to find anywhere else I've worked.
