

Reaching out to survivors in jail

As many of you may know, people who experienced childhood abuse sometimes struggle to get their lives on track, and some end up in the prison system. If there had been more support, perhaps fewer people would have ended up in jail. When the National Redress Scheme started in 2018, prisoners were not allowed to apply, which seemed pretty harsh. Tuart Place and others spoke out against this rule, and we're happy to say that, since October 2024, people in prison have been able to submit redress applications, and services like Tuart Place are able to help them.

Our redress staff are now working with people in men's and women's prisons across WA. This has given TP staff an opportunity to meet many Care Leavers and spread the word about how Tuart Place can help.

The message is: no matter where or who you are Tuart Place hasn't forgotten you.
