



Bunuru










Bunuru



**Bunuru, our second summer is marked by the blooming of
white flowers from the jarrah, marri and ghost gums. Wattle
seeds, banksia blossoms and various roots were collected
and used to flavour food and sweeten drinks.**

**Sea mullet (kalkarda), marron (gilgies), tortoises (buyi) and
possums (coomal) were popular food sources.
In late summer families would gather on the coast to hold their
annual meetings.**
